Dear Mr. Launius and The Shriners Organization:

In 1989 my son, Jason, was 10 years old and diagnosed with an extremely rare disease called mucopolysaccharidosis. We were told he would probably not live past the age of 21, so we made it our mission to provide Jason with as much life as we could fit into 21 years.

This disease attacks the individual systems of the body and in Jason's case the first system it attacked was his connective tissue. He was unable to fully open his hands, bend his elbows or walk with his heels touching the floor. His feet so mishappen we were unable to find shoes to fit him.

I don't recall who suggested The Shriners, but I will forever be in their debt. The closest Shriners Hospital to our home in Reno, Nevada was in San Francisco, CA. Jason and I loaded up our 1963 Volkswagen bus complete with a "Save the Whales" sticker and headed to SF.

The Staff of the hospital couldn't have been more professional. They calmed my son and prepared him for surgery to release the tendons in his ankles to allow him to walk flat footed for the first time in his life. We were both treated like royalty despite not having a dime to our name! He was released several days later with casts on both legs and a glimmer of hope . Jason worked hard with physical therapy and within 6 months he was able to walk flat footed in his first pair of sneakers. Thanks to medical advancements, Jason is now 42, married with a beautiful daughter. Every day I get to speak to him is a gift from God and every step he takes is a gift from The Shriners! I have waited all tis time to meet a Shriner and express my gratitude to your organization. You gave my family hope and I will never be able to repay your kindness!
